Redevelopment Update

Official Blessing and Opening Ceremony

I am in the process of finalising the date for the Official Blessing and Opening ceremony of our new building with Catholic Education Office. As part of this ceremony each of the buildings in our school will be named.

These include:

- the current administration block that accommodates the parish office and chapel
- the existing 1929 building which currently accommodates the early years classes
- the hall, incorporating preschool and soon OHSC
- the new building that accommodates the piazza, mezzanine, library, Year 3 and 4 classes and the Senior years.

The School Board have discussed what names should be considered. With the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart leaving our school and parish it was suggested that CHEVALIER - Named after Fr Jules Chevalier who founded the order of Missionaries of the Sacred Heart, would be a good choice as it would ensure that the 'heart' spirituality would continue to be acknowledged going forward.

MACKILLOP - the first Australian Saint, who began the order of the Sisters of St Joseph, who is also known as St Mary of the Cross is an obvious choice to acknowledge our foundress.



What is happening in the Preschool?

In the balloon game on the Birthday Party app, the children tap each balloon, each number word is called out in the target language (1, 2, 3, etc). The activity is scaffolded into levels and provides opportunities to revisit the vocabulary for colours that is the focus in App 2: *The Polyglots at the Beach*. These are combined in short descriptive sentences such as 'Two blue balloons'.




The children have been creating number charts inspired by the balloon chart that represents the numbers from one to ten and names them in Italian.













Children engage with a range of texts and gain meaning from these texts. This is evident, for example, when children begin to understand how symbols and pattern systems work.

We have been learning about different fruits in Italian through the ELLA App 4. One of the activities on the App is to make different fruit smoothies. The children have enjoyed mixing and making their own recipes on the App. Catherine and Kara thought it would be a nice activity to make some REAL smoothies. In preparation for the smoothies, the children came up with a possible "shopping" list of fruits. They then recorded their own smoothie recipes. On Friday, we made smoothies! On the table we had bananas, strawberries, raspberries, passionfruit, ice and milk. Everyone had a turn at adding the ingredients into the blender. All the children then lined up with their cup to try their smoothie! Most children LOVED it...we even had enough fruit to make another batch!





Helping kids tolerate discomfort

Few right-minded people want children or young people to experience hardships or difficulty. However growing up generally means that kids will experience their fair share of hardships, frustrations and challenges which lead to uncomfortable feelings.

Exercising their discomfort muscles

Tolerating discomfort is an important resilience skill. It refers to an ability to sit with an uncomfortable or emotionally painful feeling such as disappointment, apprehension, nervousness or fear. These emotions can be brought about as a result of not being picked for a team; getting lower than expected marks for an assignment; or going into new, unfamiliar situation such as school camp. These are the sorts of every day situations that can make some kids feel uncomfortable. It's helpful to think of discomfort as a 'muscle' that gets stronger with training. Each time a child or teen successfully tolerates discomfort they're reinforcing their ability to do so and cementing the knowledge that they can overcome emotional challenges.

Opportunities to practise tolerating discomfort

Opportunities for practice are plentiful and are found in common situations such as when a child or teen is: feeling hungry; wanting something they can't have; having to end screen time; contributing to household chores when they don't feel like it; missing out on a job interview; asking someone on a date or not receiving a party invitation.

It's not toughing it out

Tolerating discomfort doesn't mean toughing out an unbearable situation. It's teaching your anxious child to notice how they're feeling, naming their emotions, and practising acceptance of difficult feelings as they occur. This is done in the knowledge that what they're experiencing is temporary and that they're lovingly supported by a warm and comforting adult. Couple tolerating discomfort with social rewards (such as words of praise or shared fun activity) for coping behaviours and you're helping to build their personal resilience.
