The School Board has also been discussing the Student Awards given out at the End of Year Mass and have decided to align the Student Awards to the School's Vision and Ethos.

It has been decided to have three Awards:

Mary MacKillop Award - which will be awarded to a senior student who exhibits Josephite values of fairness, honesty, co-operation and support to the school community.

St Joseph Award - which will be awarded to a student who is a trusted hard worker and demonstrates persistence and determination when faced with challenges, just as St Joseph did.

Josiah Mitton Award - which will be awarded to an all-round, high achieving, Year 6 student and is presented by the City of Charles Sturt.

Students will receive a plaque which they will keep and their name will be recorded on a school shield.

In previous years the Student Awards were named after three members of our school community who had died whilst a member of this community. This included:

- Sister Patricia O'Dea who was Principal Sister Patricia died on the way to visiting students on school camp.
- Silvana Patrick Silvana was an Art Teacher at St Joseph's.
- Kosta Adrianopoulos Kosta was a student at St Joseph's who passed away after a serious illness.

It has been decided to remember and honour their contribution to our school community by placing an individual memorial plaque in the school garden, next to the parish house, which is a heritage listed building.

Mr and Mrs Andrianopoulos have been invited to participate in the liturgy however will be overseas on this day.

Naming of our School Buildings

Other preparations are certainly underway for the Official Blessing and Opening of our new building, The Mackillop Centre of Learning. The survey relating to naming the school hall has now been closed and the results shared with the School Board last week.

I am pleased to announce that the Hall will now be named the Sacred Heart Hall.

The **Administration Block** including the Parish House and Chapel will be named the **Chevalier** Building, acknowledging 105 years of administration by the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart.

The **new building and the original 90 year old building** now connected to the new building is the **MacKillop Centre of Learning.**

This is indeed a very exciting and important milestone for our school. You are all welcome to attend the Opening and Blessing Ceremony on 20 August. More information about this special day is included in the newsletter.

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

This Thursday the 15th August, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On this day we remember when Mary was taken ("assumed") into heaven, body and soul, after she died. This story is not in the Bible, but has been passed down from the earliest days of the Church. It is believed that Mary died in Jerusalem and was buried in a tomb. But when the apostles opened the tomb again, her body was gone. Why would God take Mary's body and soul into heaven? In part because Mary is special to God: she said 'Yes" to becoming the mother of Jesus. But God also wanted to show us that one day, all of us will share in the bodily resurrection of Jesus. Mary is the first person in the Church to experience the resurrection in its fullest.

The Feast of the Assumption is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have a whole school liturgy, without communion, due to limited priest availability.

Basketball games commenced last week at St Clair. Please be aware that players MUST have registered for the new season which runs from Term 3-4



Combining special lighting, music and costumes, the Polyglots performers entertain as children experience language related to body parts. This app also reinforces vocabulary included in the first four apps.


The Polyglots at the Circus provides play experiences that parallel children's own experiences of circuses or other performance events.

What is happening in the Preschool?
















We listened to the story *Smarty Pants*. He is a clever clown who can swim, ski, fly a plane and drive a racing car. The accompanying audio has a song that invites the children to act out the story.

The text also introduces rhyming words and phrases such as "Rum tum tay, see me play"

A kindergarten child who is an effective communicator, explores and engages in literacy in personally meaningful ways. Reading and singing along with the story Smarty Pants is about exploring word and letter sounds, rhyme, sequence and the patterns of language.

OVERSEAS BORN STUDENTS

If your child was born in a country other than Australia we are required to hold copies of current VISA's. If your resident status has changed to 'citizen' it is imperative that you provide us with copies of your Australian Passport and Citizen certificate.

Every August we are required to complete an Australian Government Census which includes reporting how many students attend our school who hold VISA's to determine eligibility to attend Government funded schools.

If your VISA has expired, conditions have changed or your status is now that of an Australian citizen please bring your original documents into the Office as a matter of priority so we can update our records. If our records are not current or we are unable to determine your eligibility to access Government funded schooling you may be charged the overseas full fee paying student rate per year.





Protecting your child's online privacy

From sharing pictures of a child's first day at school to key moments at high school, many adults don't consider the potential risks or breach of future privacy for kids. In fact, it is now become a ritual to announce the full name and date of birth of a child online within hours of them being born. This is just the beginning of a child's digital footprint.

Although children are now 'born digital', exposure in the online world can present just as many risks as the physical world can pose. Images and identifying details can be used for numerous activities that put your child at risk, from stalking, to cyberbullying, identity theft, and even digital kidnapping.

The Australian eSafety Commission warns that half of all images on paedophile image-sharing sites originate from social media sites and blogs. Parents are responsible for protecting kids until they are old enough to make their own decisions about their online presence.

So, what can parents do?

Start by 'thinking privacy' before posting images of children online. You'll be protecting their digital footprint and setting them up for a healthy relationship with the digital world.

Seek consent

Always ask others before sharing images of their children, even your family. Speak up about how you feel about images of your child being shared. When your child is old enough, ask them for consent, empowering them to understand they have a right to their privacy online. As they become teenagers, hopefully they will have more respect for what they post online and have confidence to speak to others about their consent guidelines.

Understand the settings

Check the settings of your social media channels to ensure your posts are not public. Speak to your friends and family about this and don't be afraid to ask for help to get it right. If your child has social media channels of their own, go through the settings with them to minimise the risk of unwanted shares.

Think about the detail

Avoid including children's identifiable details such as school badges, logos, uniforms, name tags or identifiable locations such as your home area or school. Alternatively, blur these details prior to posting.

Be selective


Create a simple checklist to help make decisions regarding posting online easy. What do you deem appropriate? Are you happy to share images of your children in swimwear? Do you want to avoid full-frontal face shots?

If your child is old enough, explain why you are selecting certain pictures and not sharing others. If you have a teenager who is sharing their own images, talk to them about what is appropriate and potential repercussions of not setting boundaries.

Remove metadata

Metadata on digital images records the time, date and GPS coordinates of where the photo was taken and can be accessed through shared images, and your sharing service may record your IP address. You can wipe this information with appropriate software or share screenshots of your photos to avoid metadata sharing. Screenshot sharing creates a lower resolution photo, so it's less likely to be tampered with by a third party.

Think 'privacy first' to reduce many of the risks involved with image sharing. Have conversations with your children to instil this mentality; help them build empathy; and identify the steps for minimising risk whilst helping them build a healthy relationship with technology so they can become responsible digital citizens.



Beverley Williams - Born to Fly (Author Talk)


