School Fees

At the School Board meeting last week, the 2020 fee structure was ratified.

We are committed to providing the best learning opportunities and environment for your child. As you would be aware, we receive Federal and State government grants that ensure we have resources to renumerate teaching staff and the various programmes in the school. All other expenses including support staff, school counsellor, utilities, resources, grounds and general school maintenance rely on the collection of school fees. To ensure ongoing quality services it is important, therefore that parents contribute towards the payment of school fees, within their capacity. As you would be aware, our school has three levels of fees.

We are aware of the sacrifices that families often make to attend St Joseph's Hindmarsh. With this in mind, the School Board has deliberated and decided to reduce the school fees next year to assist families to meet their commitment. Greater participation in sports is also a major objective of our school and therefore it has been decided to include interschool Sport Carnival fees such as athletics, lacrosse, cross country or similar into school fees. Therefore, during school hours sporting activities will not be invoiced to families in 2020. Extracurricular out of school hours sport participation such as soccer, basketball, camps etc. will continue to be charged to families at the rate we are charged to offer the activity.

You recently have received or will be receiving a statement rather than an invoice for Term 4 charges. This change is due to a new finance system being implemented. This statement will include all fees for 2019 up to and including 18 October. Previously you received an invoice which only detailed the current term charges. The statement itemises charges, adjustments and payments up to the statement date and this will allow you to better monitor school fee account balances.

As we are a school steeped in the Josephite Tradition, we are committed and obliged to work in partnership with families, in particular if you are experiencing difficulty, to support you with school fees. All we ask is that you make contact with Karyn Burlow or myself to discuss further.

More information regarding 2020 School Fees will be included in the school packages at the end of the year.

Looking forward to 'grooving' with you all at our concert this Friday. Please note that this is a compulsory school event. If you are unable to attend please inform your child's class teacher as this may impact on the rehearsal this Thursday.

SCHOOL BOARD NOMINATIONS

Role and Function of School Board

Each diocesan School Board has delegated responsibility from the Archbishop for the overall well-being of its school, within South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools (SACCS) and diocesan policies and guidelines. In practice, this means that in a spirit of partnership, the School Board acts to:

- develop policies that nurture the religious dimension and guide the direction of the school;
- develop the relationship between the school and the local Church;
- promote educational excellence within the school;
- support the administration of the school;
- foster harmonious and positive collaboration within the school community;
- protect children;
- monitor buildings and grounds development and maintenance;
- exercise financial stewardship of the school; and
- ensure compliance with legal obligations.

School Boards are important as they bring together, in a formal setting, the significant parties concerned with the provision of education of young people in the school.

The structure of the School Board includes:

- Parish Representative
- Chairperson
- School Principal as the executive officer
- Elected Parents
- Staff Representative
- Parent Voice Representative

The School Board is a partnership between parish and school, parents and staff, the school and Catholic Education South Australia (CESA) as a whole, and between the school community and the broader Church Community and society.

Currently, School Board meetings are held each month.

Membership of the Board will be for a period of two years for elected, nominated and appointed members. Members (other than Ex-Officio Members) should not serve more than six consecutive years. The Criteria for membership is as follows:

- possess an enthusiasm for and willingness to promote the mission of Catholic schools;
- bring to the Board their gifts and skills;
- desire to give service to their school community;
- have an ability to work cooperatively and constructively with all Members of the Board
- be prepared to undertake formation;
- have an ability and desire to uphold confidentiality in Board matters;
- have sufficient time to devote to Board duties; and

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 have a current police check clearance for the Screening and Verification Authority—Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide.

There are three vacancies. If you are interested in being part of the School Board please nominate. If you are interested in being on the School Board please complete the nomination form. Should there be more than three nominations a vote will take place.

Nominations close on Friday 6 December 2019. An online voting process will also take place along with the voting slip in this newsletter to ensure that everyone has the opportunity of participating in this important decision.

The School Board Manual is available on request or you may wish to have a conversation with me or a current member of the School Board if you would like more information about what the role involves.

As the children continue to explore ELLA app 7, we have set up a pizza kitchen, using images from the pizza cafe learning experience and other props to encourage the children to follow a sequence and become more aware of the relationship between oral and visual representations.



Fletcher and a group of classmates built a tower with blocks and numbered each one as a means to measure its height against their own heights.

The children were using mathematical concepts and thinking as they counted, wrote numerals and numbered the blocks. There was trial and error as the children problem solved, collaborated and used their thinking to gather the materials needed for their investigation.
