

Friendship Bench Project

This week our SRC students, along with our Indigenous students, will embark on a project to create a new friendship bench for our play space. This project, supported by a grant from CESA, will be facilitated by Aboriginal artist, Nikki Carabetta, who began with us earlier this week. The bench will be painted under Nikki's guidance, to incorporate themes of Reconciliation, friendship and connection and we look forward to this opportunity to learn more about Aboriginal culture and Reconciliation through this project. Many thanks to our Aboriginal Education focus teacher, Antoinette Di Paolo for coordinating this project.

NAPLAN Results

As Ruth Taylor advised in the last newsletter, our school has shown strong results in the National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) this year. These assessments took place in Term 1 for our Year 3 and 5 students, and we can now share with you our data in comparison with all Catholic Schools in South Australia and with the Catholic Schools in the western region, of which we are a part. Our results this year have shown good improvement when compared to last year's results, and our students have exceeded the CESA averages in 9 of the 10 assessment areas. This data helps to confirm that the programs and intervention we have implemented are having a positive effect on our student's learning. NAPLAN of course is just one of the sources of information we use to assess student learning and identify the impact of our teaching and learning programs.

Thank you to our administration staff who have taken on additional duties following Maria Apostolou's resignation. We know we can never replace Maria, however we are carefully looking at how best to move forward in relation to staffing, particularly in the areas of marketing, communications and ICT. Visible Wellbeing Learning

This term as a part of our Visible Wellbeing learning, we are focusing on attention and awareness. Attention and awareness are defined as skills and practices that allow us to choose what we pay attention to, and how to maximise the limited selective attention spans that we have. Skills in attention and awareness help us to choose what we would like to pay attention to and, when necessary for our wellbeing, shift our attention to things that bring us joy and energy rather than something deflating or anxiety-inducing. Term 3 Aboriginal Art Project

This term, we welcome Nikki Carabetta, an Aboriginal Art & Cultural Educator, who works with people of all ages to teach about Aboriginal culture, with a focus on art.

We are very fortunate to be able to work with Nikki this term to support and guide our school's SRC representatives to design and paint

our (newly purchased) 'friendship' & 'healing' bench. This of course, will be achieved through the lens of Aboriginal Art which will visually communicate the following underlying themes through drawing, design, and painting; reconciliation, respect, belonging, inclusivity, and acceptance.

This project links in well with our school's current Visible Health & Well-Being project and Anti-Racism focus this year.

The students will be part of the entire process from start to finish, i.e. planning and transferring the design from paper to the bench, then painting the design and dotting the background, depending on the design the students come up with.

We are very much looking forward to the students' collaborative efforts, so we can permanently fix our school's 'friendship' & 'healing bench' in a prominent space within our school grounds for students to value and utilise when needed.


